Guest Lecturer Dr Lade Smith CBE

Clinical Director (Forensic Services), SLaM and President, Royal College of Psychiatrists

Dr Shubulade Smith is a Consultant Psychiatrist at the South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust and a Visiting Senior Lecturer in the Department of Forensic and Neurodevelopmental Sciences (FANS) at the Institute of Psychiatry, Psychology & Neuroscience (IoPPN), King's College London. Dr Smith was awarded a CBE for services to forensic psychiatric intensive care in the Queen's Birthday Honours 2019.

Dr Smith was voted a BMA pioneering consultant and nominated as a Woman of the Year in 2002 for the development of her 'One Stop Shop', a medication review and physical monitoring clinic for people with mental health problems. She is known nationally and internationally for her work in the hormonal and reproductive effects of antipsychotic medications. Dr Smith is a clinician with a strong academic focus, using the latest evidence to provide her patients with optimal care. She continues to do research at the IoPPN, looking at the effect of Vitamin D in reducing psychosis (D-FEND); sexual health in people with mental health problems (SHRINE) and culturallyadapted family interventions (CAFI).

Trevor Howell Guest Lecturer Professor Tahir Masud Consultant Geriatrician Nottingham University Hospitals NHS Trust

Professor Masud is a past President of the BGS. He has a longstanding clinical and research interest in falls and osteoporosis and was one of the three co-leads in the recently published World Falls Guidelines in Age Ageing. After his undergraduate training at the University of Oxford and St Bartholomew's Hospital, London, he gained his postgraduate training in London and Newcastle-Upon-Tyne and research training as a Research Fellow in St Thomas' Hospital London.

He has a research and clinical interest in osteoporosis, falls and education and has published widely in these areas. He has previously been a scientific advisor to the National Osteoporosis Society and is the main organiser of the annual International Conference on Falls and Postural Stability, and the co-organiser of the annual Oxford Course in Osteoporosis and Metabolic Bone Disease. He also has Visiting Professorships at the Universities of Derby and Southern Denmark and has also served as the Clinical Sub-Dean at the University of Nottingham Medical School.

He is a Past President of the British Geriatrics Society (BGS), the former President of the European Union of Medical Specialists (UEMS)-Geriatric Medicine Section, the current Secretary of the Clinical Section of the International Association of Geriatrics and Gerontology (IAGG)-European Region, and a member of the executive council of the European Geriatric Medicine Society (EUGMS). Professor Masud is also the President Elect for the European Geriatric Medicine Society.
