Guest Lecture

Acute care of older adults who live with frailty: must what we do be secret knowledge?

Professor Ken Rockwood

Professor of Geriatric Medicine, Dalhousie University & Nova Scotia Health

Kenneth Rockwood is a Canadian geriatrician at Dalhousie University in Nova Scotia. He counts being awarded the President's Medal of the British Geriatrics Society as one of the greatest honours of his life. For many years, Ken's main clinical job was running the Medicine consult service in the Emergency Department, which he did for most of the pandemic. These days, he only attends in the ED while on call, so this talk should be something of a swan song regarding acute frailty management.
