A two-day residential course specifically designed for those in training roles in geriatric medicine, moving into senior roles. This course focuses on management and leadership issues that affect health services for older people.

Course Information

Using the seven domains of the NHS Leadership Framework, the course will be structured in small facilitated interactive group sessions, analysing questions around leadership, policy and management topics. The course aims to combine three elements: preparing senior trainees for geriatric consultant interviews, helping newly appointed geriatric consultants avoid potential pitfalls in their first year and providing up-to-date knowledge of relevant leadership and management issues.

- Develop contacts to render help and mentorship during your first year as a geriatric medicine consultant
