

### More than just a product...



- 1. Top sheet is soft and has a basic function, is in contact with the body and entrance of the fluid
- 2. Acquisition & Distribution layer prevents wetness of the top sheet and helps disperse liquid
- 3. Fluff core absorbs liquid quickly
- Super Absorbent Powder + Odour Dry System then hold the liquid and spread it throughout the pad
- 5. Backsheet prevents leakage onto the clothes
- 6. Wetness indicator indicates the saturation level of the product and helps visualise when a product needs to be changed

## Light range




- For light leakages drips and dribbles
- Worn with own close fitting underwear
- Some health boards removing these altogether from formularies and patients to buy own



### **WETNESS INDICATOR**





### Form range

Ontex

- For moderate incontinence
- 6 absorbencies
- Must be worn with close fitting underwear even if immobile
- Correct fitting very important



### Slip range

Ontex

- For moderate to high output
- Correct size must be chosen then absorbency
- Correct fitting
- Usually 2 people to fit

Patient cannot toilet independently if wearing this style

# This type of containment should only be considered once intractable incontinence has been diagnosed and social containment is the only option



# CHECK PRESCRIPTION & ASSESSMENT

- When was their last assessment?
- Identify specific type of bladder dysfunction
- Person-centred interventions
- Are they wearing the correct prescribed pad?

### **CHECK PERSON**

- Are they able to use the toilet?
- Do they require assistance?
- Are they on a toileting programme?
- Is faecal incontinence an issue?
- When are the leakages happening?

### CHECK ABSORBENCY

- What absorbency are they using?
- Do they use same day and night?
- Are the wetness indicators on the pad fully or partially changed?

# CHECK TOPICAL SKIN CREAMS

If a barrier cream has been used has it has been applied sparingly? The over use of oil based creams and the use of talcum powder can inhibit the pad performance. Should creams be required they should be used sparingly and only on the affected area

### **CHECK FITTING**

- Most people do not fit correctly.
- Shaped pads are 2
   piece system and must
   be worn with close
   fitting underwear at all
   times
- Taped pads need to have a seal around leg tops

# CHECK SIZE OF PAD

Usually carers think bigger is better but if an all-in one too big it will usually not work and leak



### Alternatives to pads







The design of the underwear enables Acti brief Plus to be used with a mini pad for faecal inconfinence

The collection pouch has a non-return valve

Applies the right amount of pressure to the pubic area to support the base of the penis

### Washable underwear







- WASH ALL PRODUCTS BEFORE USE
  - UNDERWEAR/BEDDING PROTECTION WASHED AT
     40 DEGREES
  - 2. BED PADS WASHED AT 76 DEGREES
- USE MILD DETERGENT WITHOUT BUILT-IN FABRIC SOFTNERS
   (WHICH CONTAIN CATIONIC SURFACTANTS)
- . DO NOT USE FABRIC SOFTERS OR BLEACH
- AIR DRY UNDERWEAR/ BEDDING PROTECTION (TURN PANTS INSIDE OUT TO EXPOSE PAD)

#### DO NOT TUMBLE DRY

- DO NOT IRON
- . BED PADS CAN BE TUMBLE DRIED







Voiding Programme	Procedure	Target Group
Bladder training	Training to increase between-void intervals and bladder capacity using urge suppression, distraction and pre-set, increasing-interval voiding times.	Cognitively intact, physically able
Prompted voiding	Active intervention with 3 stages: at fixed time points  Older person is asked if they wish to use toilet  Assistance to use toilet provided  Positive reinforcement /social approval for appropriate use of toilet given	Cognitively impaired, physically impaired
Habit training/ retraining	Individualised toileting schedule developed from residents natural voiding pattern to pre- empt incontinence episodes.	Cognitively impaired
Timed voiding	Regular fixed-interval toilet use e.g. 3 hourly	Cognitively impaired
