How NB uses our interRAI data to guide decision making

NBANH

- We have 74 nursing homes with 5100 beds
- All nursing homes are private and we fall under the umbrella of the Department of Social Development
- Implemented the interRAI LTCF assessment over 1 year in 2017



Using the data begins with the residents and their families

- Collaboration with residents and their families
 - Outcomes are validated during the multidisciplinary care reviews
- In the perfect world, families would ask inquire about the outcome scales as they notice changes



Data can support home decisions

- RUG grouping scores is used to allocate the available staff
- Homes are able to eliminate some of their “routine paper-based assessments”
- The Quality Indictors can be compared to identify specific interventions to optimize care
 - National benchmarking is invaluable



Data can support government decisions

- Social Development integrated the interRAI assessments into their yearly inspection processes
- Care plans are evaluated based on alignment to the triggered CAPs
- National benchmarking helps to identify homes at higher risk of adverse resident outcomes
- When funding requests are submitted, Social Development uses the interRAI data to justify needs
